A year-end review of our membership revealed the following information:

We learned that Paramount Studios purchased 2700 acres of the old Rancho Las Virgenes in 1927. For 25 years Paramount used this "movie ranch" for film production that included entertainment giants such as Cecil B. Demille, Gary Cooper, Barbara Stanwyck, Bob Hope, Claudette Colbert and the Cisco Kid.

In 1956 the Paramount Auto Racetrack was built on the property where the 1957 movie Devils Racetrack was filmed. It was considered one of the most challenging courses in the country but was closed 18 months later due to three fatalities. Our own Rick Phillips worked the track as a pit crew member during its heyday.

In 1980 the National Park Service began to manage the ranch. Television shows were also shot here such as Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman from 1992 to 1997. Paramount Ranch's diverse landscapes allow filmmakers to create distant locales to this day.



We next paid a visit to Sheriff Mike's jail where we proceeded to lock up our tour leader, Bob Travis. Someone found the keys and he was released after time served. Our final stop was a visit to the town saloon. Here we learned the magic of Hollywood where one of our members was knocked out with a beer bottle for drunk and disorderly conduct. Of course the beer bottle was a prop made out of thin plastic so no harm was done.



We wrapped up the day with lunch under a shaded picnic area and then proceeded to head for home. It was a great day for Model A touring and Hollywood history.

John McDannel USAF 1963-1968

My home town was Covina, California. I graduated from Covina High School in 1959, where I played football and ran track. That year I was awarded the honor of "Athlete of the year". In 1961 I won the Mt. San Antonio College Decathlon and set a US National record in the 480 yard Shuttle Hurdles. In 1965 I graduated from the University of La Verne with a BA in Economics and a minor in Air Science. I also played football and ran track at La Verne. As a college freshman, I enrolled as a cadet in the USAF ROTC program at USC. In 1965 I was assigned to Biggs AFB El Paso, Texas where I was commissioned a second lieutenant and was awarded the "Commandant of Cadets" award. I was awarded my pilots wings in 1968 and was assigned to the Strategic Air Command. I flew the T-41, T-37, T-38, and was awarded an F-4 Phantom out of pilot training.

My flying career continued after the Air Force as a commercial pilot for United Airlines. During the 1980 presidential campaign I was selected to pilot a Boeing 727 chartered by the Republican National Committee to fly the then candidate (and later President and First Lady) Ronald and Nancy Reagan around the US during the final six months of the campaign for President.

I flew as a United Airlines Captain on the Boeing 747-400 before retiring in 2001 following a 32-year career at United.

I was type rated to fly the following aircraft: B-747-400, B-747-100\200, B-767 100/200, B-757, B-737, B-727 100/200, A-320 and served as a Flight Engineer on the DC-10. I was elected to serve as Chairman of the Airline Pilots Association Council #57 and was a board member of the Airlines Pilot Association in Washington D.C. In 1993 I was awarded "UAL Captain of the Year" and received the carrier's "Humanitarian Award" in 1987. In 2004, I was interviewed as a candidate for the CEO position of United Airlines.

My 25-year banking career with Trans World Bank Corp. ran concurrently with my career with United Airlines. In 1967 I earned an MBA from USC.

My wife, Mary, and I have been married for more than 51 years. Mary served for more than 40 years as a grammar school teacher in the Covina Unified School District. We have three daughters. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR MODEL A

This month's column will deal with learning how to maintain your Model A Ford. Part of the enjoyment of owning a Model A Ford is understanding how to take care of your car. There is a lot more to maintaining a Model A than just washing the car and polishing the chrome. We should all be aware of the basic maintenance these cars require if they are to be kept in good repair and ready for the road. Of course, our abilities and facilities vary greatly. Some owners have a complete well equipped shop and are capable of performing major restoration work while others may just have a few basic tools in their garage. Just knowing the basics will go a long way to keep your Model A in good condition.

First of all, the owner of a Model A needs to know how to service the car and do basic repairs. A good place to start to gain knowledge is to read the "Instruction Book" (Owner's Manual) that would have come with your car when new. If you do not have an "Instruction Book", good reproductions are available from most parts suppliers. This

little book contains a lot of information including basic maintenance, lubrication, simple troubleshooting and repairs. There are also instructions on how to start and drive the Model A. Now, some of you may say I have gone too far, we all know how to drive a Model A but not all owners may know how to double clutch when down shifting, to not rest their foot on the clutch pedal when driving down the road or to shift into a lower gear when descending a steep hill to save the brakes. You would be surprised just how much information is contained in this little book.

Many other good books have been written that deal with repair and restoration of the Model A Ford. One series of books I have found especially helpful is three books titled "Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook" written by Les Andrews. Les has a vast knowledge of the Model A Ford and has done an outstanding job



putting together three books which are mainly dedicated to the mechanical maintenance and repair of the Model A.

Volume #1 includes maintenance, repair and overhaul of the mechanical components. Most owners feel this book is the most useful. Volume #2 deals mostly with modifications and accessories for your Model A. Volume #3 address diagnoses, troubleshooting and problem solving.

Another good source of information is the club. If you need help, just ask another member. If he, or she, does not know the answer, they can usually recommend another member who will be able to help you. The SAA's web site also has a very good selection of technical articles written by Tom Endy. Tom has many years of experience with Model A's and has put together a series of well written very informative articles. If you are doing a repair and need a little guidance or help, contact The Low End Boys. This is a group within the club of very knowledgeable members who will help you with a problem or lend you a hand when needed. Periodically, the club schedules seminars which provide a good opportunity to learn more about your Model A.

Having your Model A just sitting in the garage is not much fun. If you take care of your Model A, it will take care of you and not leave you stranded on the side of the road. Keeping your Model A in good condition and driving it often will greatly add to your enjoyment of our hobby.

Tech Tip - Cutout Relay Problems by Chris Wickersham

This month's Tip deals with more poor quality electrical components. It seems most replacement electrical components made in China are very poor quality.

For more than 6 months, one of our members had been dealing with an intermittent problem with his Model A. Sometimes, the car would just quit while driving down the road and it could not be restarted. Other times, the battery would be dead when he wanted to drive his car. After several visits by the low end boys, the problem was traced to a replacement generator cutout relay that was made in China. Sometimes the cutout would work properly but occasionally it would stick closed causing the circuit breaker the owner installed at the starter to open and disable all power to the car.

Good quality cutouts with a diode in place of the mechanical relay are available from most suppliers. You can sometimes find NORS (new, old replacement stock) cutouts at swap meets and on EBay that are USA made. Just be sure you know what you are purchasing. Many original cutouts are still good and serviceable. These were very good quality and



rarely caused a problem. Cutouts made in China can usually be identified by the gold colored cover.
