miles. We are looking forward to driving to Loveland, CO for the 2016 National MAFCA Meet. Care to join us?



Hidden California Gas & Diesel Tax Set to be effective January 1, 2015 by Bob Moore

Stop California's Hidden Tax on Fuel

In 2006, Governor Brown signed into law, AB 32, The California Global Warming Solutions Act. This law requires that greenhouse gas emissions be reduced to the 1990 level by 2020. Annually, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) sets a statewide cap on emissions which translates into individual caps for large industrial facilities. The caps are reduced by 1 to 2% per year. A "cap and trade" system allows companies that will exceed their emissions cap to purchase surplus carbon allowances of other companies.

California's cap and trade regulations have applied only to large industrial facilities and not gasoline or diesel. Effective January 1, 2015, the AB 32 regulations are set for the first time to cover gasoline and diesel. This means that fuel providers, refiners and importers, will be required to purchase carbon allowance or permits for every gallon of gasoline and diesel fuel they sell in California.

This is the hidden tax. How much cost will this tax add to a gallon of gasoline? CARB estimates the cost could increase 16 cent to 76 cents per gallon over the next few years.

Commemoration of the 1930's American Dust Bowl at the Pasadena Library Saturday, September 6



Model A Ford Club of America

Below is a report written by Dan Foulk, President of MAFCA, which appeared on the MAFCA web site in July. Dan comments on the Insurance coverage provided by MAFCA for the benefit of all MAFCA chapters. This has been a topic of concern and discussion by our SAA board of directors.

MAFCA Insurance

Insurance! With the advent of the Affordable Care Act, it's a word we hear a lot these days. What I want to discuss in this column is a very different kind of insurance, the insurance that MAFCA provides for its chapters.

MAFCA provides two policies, liability and D&O (Directors & Officers) insurance for its chapters in the United States, Puerto Rico and Canada. Liability insurance has been provided for chapters since the 1960's. Chapter D&O insurance was added in 2009. It is important that you understand the insurance covers chapters and chapter leadership, it is not a substitute for your own personal insurance. The liability insurance that MAFCA provides means that if your chapter has a claim for some reason, the chapter would be represented by our insurance company. D&O insurance is provided for any chapter member performing a chapter leadership function. The amount of coverage for chapter liability insurance is two million dollars, chapter D&O insurance coverage is five million dollars. There is an additional four million dollar umbrella policy. This means that if the initial two million dollars of liability coverage is inadequate, then the umbrella policy kicks in and provides four million more of coverage.

MAFCA insurance covers chapters and chapter leadership, not cars or individuals. If you are under the impression that you don't need insurance on your Model A because it is provided by MAFCA, you are wrong. If you are driving without automobile insurance, then you better get some, because you are not covered under MAFCA's policies.

Those of you in leadership positions in your chapters know that for the past three years, MAFCA has solicited chapters to share in the cost of insurance. Ten years ago chapter liability insurance cost MAFCA \$3,679 annually, D&O insurance hadn't been added yet. In 2014, the cost for chapter liability insurance is \$33,100, nearly a 10-fold increase. Chapter D&O insurance adds another \$6,500 for a total of \$39,600. In 2006, we had a lawsuit, because of that, the insurance underwriter looked more closely at our activities and determined our liability was greater than anticipated. The cost of our liability insurance jumped \$11,744 in 2007, and has increased an average \$2,500 annually since. *Continued on page 8*

Bumper Clamp Safety Tip

This safety tip is just something to think about. Original Model A bumper clamps were a one piece forging that was chrome plated in 1928,1929, and early 1930. In 1930 and 1931 the clamps were a one piece forging with a stainless clad cap. The original bumper clamps are very strong and usually will not break. Our modern reproduction bumper clamps are made by one of the following four production processes:

- A pot metal casting poured around a bolt, also known as die casting. These are very cheap to purchase and have a high tendency to crack and break, especially if they are over tightened.
- Cast steel poured around a bolt. These are also prone to cracking and breaking. The more they are tightened the greater the chance of failure.
- Forged steel. These are like the original construction and very strong, they are also expensive.
- Forged stainless Steel. These are bullet proof bumper clamps that are one piece and they do not break or rust. They too are very expensive.

This is a safety thought. Do not over tighten your bumper clamps. They only need to be torqued between 25 to 30 foot pounds. More torque than that will place undue stress on the clamp. Make sure the lock washer is in good condition with spring. I use the reproduction 1928 Ford script bumper clamps on my Model A. These are a pot metal bumper clamp, so I also use a clear zip tie as a safety restraint. I would suggest using zip ties to anyone using the pot medal or cast steel bumper clamps. The zip ties will prevent the bumper from falling off of the Model A if the bumper clamp breaks. Use heavy duty-high strength nylon ties rated at 120 pounds of holding power. This type of strength is only made in the United States. It would not be much fun to run over your own bumper.

You might ask, why doesn't MAFCA get quotes from other companies? We've tried that! In January 2007, when we received our liability renewal notice, the amount was \$92,000. This caused much consternation among the board. There was no way MAFCA could pay that much! It was looking like MAFCA would no longer be able to provide chapters with liability insurance, clearly an important benefit to chapters who belong to MAFCA. Chapters were told that March 1, 2007 would be the last day that MAFCA could offer liability insurance to them. If they had events scheduled after that date, they would need to provide their own insurance.

The search went out for new insurers. Approximately 25 companies were contacted and asked to provide quotes. By mid-February, we had received three quotes; the other companies could not, or did not want to insure us. The three quotes we received were \$52,000, \$44,000, and \$38,000, still too expensive! Prolonged negotiation with one company followed, and eventually, the price of \$15,432 was worked out with our current insurer, J. C. Taylor. Our insurance continued uninterrupted.

Our policy is a blanket policy. The same policy is sold to multiple organizations; the coverage is the same for all. There have been a few chapters who have requested to be dropped from MAFCA's insurance because they have their own policies. MAFCA cannot drop individual chapters. All chapters that are in countries as stated in paragraph two above are covered, if we drop any, we get into a policy customized for MAFCA, and the overall cost goes up. If your Chapter has their own insurance, you have double coverage, in the event of a claim that could be beneficial.

What I have attempted to do here is to give you a summary of the insurance that MAFCA provides for the chapters. The liability and umbrella insurance policy is 214 pages long; the D&O policy adds another 26 for a total of 240 pages. If you need further or more specific information, contact our Insurance Liaison with your questions. Additional information can be obtained from our website by reading the MAFCA policy on insurance. The policy number is P2SO3. You can find it by going to the site index, and looking under "P" for policies.


