





Mt Wilson Tour

We had to cancel the Brewery tour due to the limitation they placed on us this year, allowing us to bring a total of only 10 cars. In its place we have organized a tour to Mount Wilson.

Our club traveled to Mt. Wilson and toured the observatory 4 or 5 years ago. It was a successful tour and we have had interest from both those who did participate as well as those who missed it. We have arranged for a special guided tour of the observatory and its facilities. We will have two docents for our group.

They have made a few changes since our last visit. They are now charging for the special tours, \$12.00 per person. A new snack bar has been opened at the pavilion where we will have lunch. Box lunches can be prepared in advance for our group at a cost of \$15.00 per person. We are suggesting that you bring our own lunches and have a picnic in the pavilion. MAFCA National Convention


July 14-18, 2014 -- Puyallup, WA



Fender Wells - The rest of the story

During my presentation on "What's My Model A worth", at the end of the meeting I made a statement concerning "welled" front fenders that was inaccurate. At this point you may be saying "Who Cares"? Well, I care, so I intend to attempt to correct it. Or at least add some amplification.

I said "All front fender wells were dealer installed". Not true. From initial production in 1928 to the end of production in 1931, these fenders were considered to be accessories and during the 1928 model year they were sold by dealers. Beginning in 1929 and continuing, on, they were factory installed if the car was so ordered by the customer. It was quite common for dealers to install welled fenders on cars in their inventory, especially the open cars, as they perceived the installation to give the cars a more attractive upscale look.

Light commercial vehicles (pickup trucks, delivery sedans, station wagons) all came from the factory with welled fenders as there was no place to mount a spare wheel.

Beginning in 1930 with the introduction of the Tudor Deluxe Phaeton and the A-400 Convertible sedan, the spare tire mounted in a left front welled fender from the factory. All right side welled fenders on these cars, as well as all other models, were dealer installed. We are accustomed to seeing the spare in the left front fender but, in fact, its location is a safety issue. In the early days of mostly two lane roads, a motorist attempting to change a flat tire would be standing in traffic while removing the spare. The same situation exists today in the breakdown lane of a busy freeway. So, be careful out there.

Isn't it amazing how much explanation can be required of a basic generalization? Basic rule – don't generalize unless it is completely accurate!

President's message continued:

Last month I said that from time to time I would report on some of the major actions taken by the Board. At the last meeting the Board attempted to reach consensus on new Club apparel to include hats, shirts and jackets. Unfortunately, it was unable to do so. However, a motion was made and passed that the Club purchase one dozen white polo shirts of assorted sizes with the Club logo for the purpose of obtaining Club members acceptance. When an attempt to place the order was made, the vendor indicated that a minimum order of 24 was required. As a result, the order was put on hold. The Board will continue to pursue this project.
