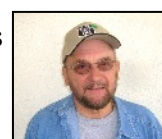

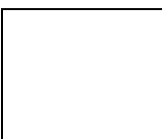

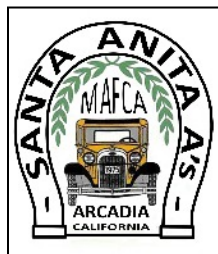
Who is that group anyway?

Leaking Carburetor - Carburetor float wear

Most Model A carburetors encountered today have been subjected to considerable use. The most frequently overlooked side effect of that use is a small dimple worn into the top of the float from the valve needle. The effect of this dimple is a lateral bind on the valve needle that prevents it from closing completely and sealing.

The brass float material is fairly soft and it is easy to blend out the ridges of a typical wear spot by sanding from front to back by hand, then buffing. There are many alternatives, but choose your best method to carefully taper and blend the surface and the valve will operate smoothly and reliably.

Old Things Can Leak - but you already know that

Model A Cowl Gas Tank Construction

These pictures show the internal baffle construction found inside of Model A cowl gas tanks. Note that it is nearly impossible to effectively reach all areas of the tank for cleaning through the openings. It would also be difficult to insure coverage of all the surfaces with a tank sealing compound.



Sometimes the spot welds on the baffles break due to fatigue from fuel sloshing, and this can cause an annoying rattle inside the gas tank. Also seen is the shape of the gas tank in the areas behind the external brackets.
