


Ponder This

As most of you know, our club is a Chapter of MAFCA and there are many benefits for us as MAFCA members. One of the benefits is receiving the bi-monthly magazine called "The Restorer". In the March/ April edition which we just received, there are some very interesting articles. While the magazine has many areas of interest, this issue has some pertinent to our beloved Model A.

When choosing to tour with your Model A you will find most members like to add an overdrive to make the touring easier on the engine. It also gives you greater flexibility when climbing hills. The article points out the three most commonly used, and the differences. This is a good article, even if you already have an overdrive.

Another article regarding an often troublesome part is about the differences in the Distributors used. As many of us have found, when on a tour or even when just around town, the distributor is like the heart of the engine. When it starts to have a heart attack your engine does not want to run as it should. I point this out because many of us will be on the road this spring and summer and a little preventive maintenance should be done to make your outings more of a pleasure. First and foremost, it is advisable to use just a few drops of Bob Travis's famous oil to lubricate the shaft. You should also check the setting of the points. Some differences in the type of distributor will require more-or-less work. I suggest you read the article and take appropriate action.


Lastly and most importantly, the Steering Column written by President Alex Janke covers areas such as touring, insurance, cost of doing business, MAFFI museum, and membership. This is all very informative, but what impacts all of us the most is a law suit. The outcome of suits has always resulted in changes. I suspect this one will be no different. They have already instituted a new form for a "waiver" to be used when attending events. They have already indicated that next year the cost of the D&O insurance covering Directors and Officers, which we have been asked to donate to in order to offset the cost this year, will be billed to the Chapters next year. We will be receiving the discount that we get as a benefit of being MAFCA members.

FROM THE SHOP BENCH by Bob Travis



Did you know that the 1928 Model A Ford was the first Ford to have what we motorists take for granted? That's right - a gas gauge. Simple in it's design, the gauge is a mechanical float indicator and for purposes of this article it is the float that we will concentrate on.

From the beginning, the float was made from cork material, then coated with a heavy coat of shellac to make the cork impervious to gasoline. The technique worked well until the dreaded ethanol gasoline was introduced about 2 years ago. The



alcohol content of the gas attacked the shellac, destroying the cork's ability to float.

The major Model A parts suppliers got wind of the problem and introduced a neoprene float. This new float appeared to solve the problem. However, it has now been discovered that even the neoprene can not stand up to ethanol fuel. So, what is the answer?

Install a brass float like like those used in the carburetor, but of a different design. These floats are available from Mike's Affordable Parts. These floats are easy to install once the gauge is removed from the tank (See page 1-172 of Les Andrew's Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook) or call me. I'll talk you through it. A two piece inexpensive tool is required. Once installed you'll never have to replace it again and you will have a working gas gauge to rely on.

This ethanol gas problem makes me so mad I could spit! I have consistently recommended the use of STA-BIL fuel treatment to counter the ill effects of using this gas. At a recent club meeting, one of the members reported that he had added STA-BIL to several of his cars only to discover later that would not start because of fuel problems. I do not believe that STA-BIL caused these problems. I think that the fuel had been in the tank a long time (6 Months or more) before treatment and therefore was "bad gas". STA-BIL is not designed to rehab bad gas but rather to prevent "fresh fuel" from deteriorating. Thus, I stand by my recommended use of STA-BIL in combustion chamber engines in which the fuel will not be entirely consumed within 6 months.

President's message continued:

New members may not be aware that about \$3.00 of everyone's dues goes to pay for our club's membership in the Association of California Car Clubs, Inc. They are a "Watch-Dog" organization which tracks what is happening in Sacramento to make sure that we can enjoy our hobby of driving our cars and not be taxed out of business, as well as keeping an eye on proposed new laws which may affect us. The "ACCC" also encourages individuals to join their organization. I have applications for those who are interested in joining on a personal level.

I also encourage members who own Model A Town Sedans to join a great club. The "Model A Ford Town Sedan Times" is one of their publications, and they have a library of information with books, CD's & DVD's about restoring your car. Again, I have applications, or you can email Dan Gambill, President of the club at TownSedanClub@Hotmail.com.

It is sad to report the passing of 2 of our members this past month. A \$100.00 donation from the Santa Anita A's to the American Cancer Society was made in memory of Harry Mycroft as suggested by his wife, Helga; and a \$100.00 donation was made to Vistas Hospice in memory of Harold Baquet, as suggested by his wife, Sally.

Our club also sent \$75.00 to MAFCA (Model A Ford Club of America) to cover insurance for our officers and directors.

A BIG THANKS to Bob Travis for putting together a wonderful tour to Palm Springs and the surrounding areas. If you didn't go on this one, you missed a terrific time.

This month found us at Wilbert Smith's garage checking out his 1929 Coupe. We tuned up his distributor and changed the carburetor. It is running much better. On another day, Mickey put a float in his gas tank and new gaskets. He used a neoprene float, not one made from cork. They also installed a locking Moto-Meter radiator cap.

On another day we went to Frank Izbinski's house to work on his 1931 Tudor. He was having problems with the right rear light and missing body bolts in the car. The body bolts were easy to fix, three missing nuts and washers up front. The short in the rear light was a bigger problem. After much time, Mickey found the problem, fixed it and left with a happy Frank.

Our Technical Director, Bob Travis asked me to go look at Joe Giocomarra's Model A front end with possibly bad king pins. We picked up Joe Wilson to go along. It turned out the king pins were ok but, the front bearings were loose and the front brake floaters were sticking. It took all of us three hours to put everything in working order. Bob knows brake work. Joe Giocamarra took us out to lunch, at the Hill Street Café. We had blue cheese hamburgers which were very good. I am thankful for the invite and to watch Bob work. 


