

Twenty-two Santa Anita A's members crossed the boarder into Orange County to look at cars, buy raffle tickets and eat pancakes. It was a very good Model A weather day.



I contacted the Orange County Club to ask how things turned out. Their club recorded 220 Model A's and 96 "other" cars, which included Model T's, Hot Rods and some Moderns, for a total of well over 300 cars. They reported they had fewer A's and more T's this year with the total to be about the same.



They sold 1150 tickets, but used up about 1300 plates. The raffle was a success, with the two bicycles drawing the most tickets. They estimated the total attendance to be over 2,000, but have

no way of knowing because many people bring their cars but don't eat breakfast, or come but don't show a car.

They plan to hold the event again next year; same place, in late April. I recommend it.

After retiring in 1995, he worked more or less as a full time salesman for his son's company that developed and sold proprietary software.

Bob and his wife Judy joined the Santa Anita A's in November, 1996. His first Model A was a 1929 Roadster Pickup purchased from a former member, Andrew Morrison. Later he purchased his current sedan from a family who had purchased it from John Chandler in 1958.

Bob was the president for two years (2001 & 2002), Secretary for one, Vice President for two or three years, then as the past president, became a Board Member and later as the tour director for several years. Bob and Judi have two children, Mari, who lives in Pasadena and John who lives in Tustin.

Marlin Perry – Board Member

Marlin was born in Woodruff, South Carolina and has one brother, William Perry and a sister Nancy Stancil. Marlin worked for Ralphs Grocery Co. for 41 years. He bought first Model A when he was 14 years old, a Coupe which cost \$25.

Marlin was one of the founding members of the Santa Anita A's and served as President in 1980, 1983 and 1986. He is the leader of "The Low End Boys" and organizer of the highly successful Santa Anita A's men's breakfast.

GOOD VISION IN A DOWNPOUR

Driving in the rain -- This may save your life

How to achieve good vision while driving during a heavy downpour. We are not sure why it is so effective; just try this method when it rains heavily. This method was given me by a Police friend who had experienced and confirmed it. It is useful....even driving at night. It is one method used by Canadian Military Drivers for years.

Most of the motorists would turn on HIGH or FASTEST SPEED of the wipers during heavy downpour, yet the visibility in front of the windshield is still bad..... In the event you face such a situation, just try your SUN GLASSES (any model will do), and miracle! All of a sudden, your visibility in front of your windshield is perfectly clear, as if there is no rain. Make sure you always have a pair of SUN GLASSES in your car, as you are not only helping yourself to drive safely with good vision, but also might save your friend's life by giving him this idea.. Try it yourself and share it with your friends! Amazing, you still see the drops on the windshield, but not the sheet of rain falling. You can see where the rain bounces off the road. It works to eliminate the "blindness" from passing semi's spraying you too. Or the "kickup" if you are following a semi or car in the rain. They ought to teach that little tip in driver's training. It really does work..

This next warning is a another good one! I wonder how many people know about this: A 36 year old female had an accident several weeks ago and totaled her car. A resident of Kinburn, Ontario she was traveling between Kinburn & Ottawa. It was raining, though not excessively, when her car suddenly began to hydro-plane and literally flew through the air.. She was not seriously injured but very stunned at the sudden occurrence! When she explained to the OPP Officer what had happened he told her something that every driver should know - NEVER DRIVE IN THE RAIN WITH YOUR CRUISE CONTROL ON . She thought she was being cautious by setting the cruise control and maintaining a safe consistent speed in the rain. But the Officer told her that if the cruise control is on when your car begins to hydro-plane and your tires lose contact with the pavement, your car will accelerate to a higher rate of speed making you take off like an airplane. She told the OPP Officer that was exactly what had occurred. The Officer said this warning should be listed on the driver's

seat sun-visor - NEVER USETHE CRUISE CONTROL WHEN THE PAVEMENT IS WET OR ICY, along with the airbag warning. We tell our teenagers to set the cruise control and drive a safe speed - but we don't tell them to use the cruise control only when the pavement is dry. The only person the accident victim found, who knew this (besides the officer), was a man who had a similar accident, totaled his car and sustained severe injuries. NOTE: Some vehicles (like the Toyota Sienna Limited XLE) will not allow you to set the cruise control when the windshield wipers are on.















