# **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE** - BOB TRAVIS

As I announced in the Jan 2015 Issue of the Spoken Wheels the Club is celebrating its 40th Anniversary this year. A lot of marriages don't last that long! In the next 5 editions of the Club newsletter I will share with you the history of the Santa Anita A's by presenting a summary of the club's progress from its beginning to present in 10 year increments. I am proud to have been asked by the Board to do this and will do all I can to portray the great people and events that have resulted in a strong club dedicated to the preservation of the Model A Ford. So , here we go with the first installment. Until next time, drive an A every day.

### Part One - In the Beginning - 40 years ago

Much of the following information is the result of an interview I conducted with Brad Balmot who served as the first President. We are very fortunate that Brad had the foresight to capture this history as seen through his eyes at the time.

On May 23, 1975 eight men dedicated to the preservation of the Model A Ford met and drew up a document to petition the Model A Ford Club of America for recognition as a Chapter. They were Brad Balmot, Marlin Perry, Tom Wellnitz, Erv Dly, Doc Klechner, Gene Reinhart, Gordon Johnson, and Erin Wirtz. As a part of the petition, a club name was required. Brad shared the following remembrance of selecting a name: "There were suggestions like BALDWIN'S LUCKY A'S and HENRY FORD'S A'S. There was even the suggestion of naming our club THE BRASS NUTS. I've still got that T shirt in my closet that has THE BRASS NUTS OF ARCADIA silk-screened on the back of it. We finally agreed that the club should be called the SANTA ANITA A'S, and the first club crisis was over."

I asked Brad how the first Club officials were chosen. His reply: "Our first election was basic. After the officers were elected, (more like inducted!) the first five hands up were chosen to make up the Board of Directors. Those who didn't get their hands up fast enough ended up with jobs like Tour Director, Raffle Chairman, and Hostess. Our first paper was called THE BULLETIN and Marlin and Elaine Perry

# Mel and Maria Foye

(The Foye story according to Mel)

I don't recall cars being a big thing to me until we moved from the "big city", Des Moines, to a very rural farm in northern Minnesota (Rural as in – the nearest town had 57 people). On



my second day there I was put on a tractor at age 11 and plowed for the rest of the day. I was hooked on being "mobile". By the end of the first week I was also driving a 1949 Ford and a 1947 Chevy 1½ ton truck. I learned that driving was great but farming sucked!

My first car was a '46 Ford 6 which, when I first opened the trunk, tfound potatoes growing in there. Next up was a '49 Ford V8, then a '54 Ford with a very loud split exhaust that gave me several chances to work on my "Good evening officer" greeting.

Just prior to moving to California in 1962 I moved to the dark side when I left Ford and bought a '58 Chevrolet. I took a job as a commercial insurance underwriter and was in that profession for 30 plus years.

In 1963 I bought a '62 Vette and in 1966 added a '56 Corvette. The '56 was turned into a drag race only car. The '62 was a combination daily driver and drag racer. I later spent some time racing on the old Riverside road course and several high speed, 12 hour Monte Carlo type runs to Vegas, Mexico, etc. I still have both cars. Drag racing gave way to racing oval tracks and living long enough to beat the heck out of my son's '67 Camaro with a NASCAR set up on road courses.

While selling our 67 Camaro in Iowa in 1993, I came across a 30 Ford chopped, channeled and Zed frame, non-running real project car; it was a mess but it was a hot rod. I needed something to tow it home so I bought a '57 Chevrolet. You get a lot of positive attention in 2,100 miles of towing a '30 hot rod with a puke yellow '57!

Until I could get to work on it a "little later" the '30 Ford hot rod went into my semi-trailer at a friend's shop 60 miles away from Azusa where I live. "Later" became 17 years before any work was started on the car. She ain't nice yet, she ain't done yet but the 302 Ford pulls her and the disc brakes stop her. I'm almost to a point where I can get her home and that will speed up matters.

Maria and I have six grand-kids, six great-grand kids and three great-great-grand kids. Maria still works as an insurance broker. We enjoy theater and traveling to historic places.

It goes without saying that being married to Maria for 39 years, her love and support makes this whole pony ride possible. Joining this club, learning from the members and being around hands-on guys has been a real plus for me: one of my smarter moves.

# Ken Mallory receives award on 70th Anniversary of V-E Day

Ken Mallory was awarded the French Legion of Honor Medal for his service in France during WWII at a ceremony held aboard the Battleship USS Iowa on May 8<sup>th</sup>. Ken was among twenty servicemen from southern California honored at the event. The Legion of Honor is France's highest award. It is conferred upon men and women, either French citizens or foreign nationals, for outstanding achievement in military or civilian life. The award was created by Napoleon in 1802.



"It was a big day for me" Ken said. "It was the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of V-E day. Along with 19 other servicemen I was awarded the French Legion of Honor Medal. It was awarded to those of us who had been active in eliminating the German army in France. Mr. Axel Cruau, the Council General of France made the award. The recipient of the award must be alive and over 90 years of age. Lunch and a military flyover was part of the presentation. It really was a special day for me".



Ken served in the US Army from March 1943 to October 1945. He first served in the Aleutians then deployed to Europe where he participated in the "Battle of the Bulge". Ken is a member of the Los Angeles chapter of the National Organization, "Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge".

# Time to Update your Information - Please!

Every year about this time we ask members to tell us if the information we have in the club's roster is still correct. # How to access and use the SAA web site

#### To access web site:

- Mickey passed around tire tread depth gauges from Coker Tire. 1. Enter the SAA web site address on your browser address line (santaanitaas.org). The SAA home page will appear.
  - 2. Click on the Section you wish to view. A sub menu will appear.
  - 3. Select the option you wish to view.

- 1. Open the web site (see above) and select the Members Only Section. A menu will appear asking for a password.
- 2. Enter the password (ask someone) using all capital letters. A menu will appear.
- 3. Select what you chose to do: (a) View Roster,
- 4. (b) Correct Roster, (c) view parts for sale.

#### To confirm, correct or change the information shown in the Roster under your name:

- Open the SAA web Site and select the "members only" tab. 1.
- 2. Enter the password if requested (ask someone).
- Choose the "Roster" option to view the information under your name.
- 5. To correct errors or make changes to the information, select the "Roster correct or update roster" option. A web form will appear.
- 5. The first portion of the form is used to confirm all information is correct.
- 6. The second portion of the form is used to make changes and corrections.
- 7. Enter your first and last name then enter information only in the fields where changes or corrections are to be made.

# FROM THE BENCH

#### Model A Grounding System

A poor ground circuit can be an invisible troublemaker on the Model A, probably more so than most realize because it is usually intermittent.

The battery ground cable is connected to the center frame cross member. With rusty, greasy, or freshly painted components, the ground path to the engine can be interrupted. With the generator or alternator anchored to the engine it is imperative that the ground circuit be there.

When the Model A was new the ground path could travel along the frame rails and through the front or rear springs. The front spring connected to the wishbone assembly, which provided a path to the clutch housing was a good connection to the engine. The rear spring provided a path through the differential housings, then up through the torque tube to the transmission and finally the engine.

With age, rust would form on the springs and a build up of mud and grease on and between connecting components, creating the potential for ground interruption. Additionally, on a fresh restoration, if the springs are given several coats of paint, ground continuity can be interrupted.

The rear engine mounts do not provide a good ground path because of the rubber pads that insulate them from the frame. Float-A-Motors are even worse because of the rubber donuts used. There is some grounding potential from the gas line to the gas tank and subsequently through the body bolts, but this path has a lot of room for deterioration.

Aside from all these factors, all new Model A's came with engine splash pans. These pans provided an excellent path for ground to reach the engine. If you choose not to install these pans on your Model A, then you should definitely install an extra ground cable for assurance that you always have ground at the engine.

This can be accomplished by purchasing a 24" ground or battery cable with eyelets on each end. (A 12" cable is better but harder to find.) Attach one end to the center cross member using the same bolt that fastens your regular ground cable. Attach the other end to one of the bolts that holds the cover on the transmission. Or, fasten one end of the cable to a front frame rail in one of the holes provided for the engine splash pans and the other end to one of the engine pan bolts.

If you have had problems with generator or alternator failure this is an easy and inexpensive supplement to your ground system and you can rest assured that your ground circuit integrity will always be secure.
