

Board Approves Change in Club's Operating Year





Hill Climb at Murreta Springs

It was a great day for a "hill climb". The sun was shining and the temperature was perfect. The event took place in Murrieta, CA just north of Temecula off highway 15. It was sponsored by the F.A.S.T. Organization.



Two of our members participated: Art Moore in his yellow 1930 boat tail speedster and his wife Olive in her 1926 Model T speedster. Both cars built by Art have a four cylinder Model B block with a Riley four port head. A total of twenty-seven cars participated with twenty-nine drivers as well as about 185 spectators.



There was everything from stock Model T's to historic sprint cars — what a show! The distance of the course was 1/10 of a mile or 528 feet and about a 6% grade. Cars ran one at a time with a timing clock that recorded their E.T. (elapse time) to the thousandths of a second and their milesper-hour. Each driver could run as many times as time permitted and their lowest E.T. counted for the competition. There are many categories so there were many class winners. The "King" of the hill this year was Olive with an E.T. of 8.202 seconds beating Art who ran an 8.203. Do the math — she won by one thousandths of one second! Congratulations!

For the second time, the horse show was canceled on us due to rain. We had 25 members, plus 2 guests driving in 11 Model A's. We did have lunch and visited the Farm Store on campus. Some of the group went to talk to the horses. Instead of us sitting in the stands and watching the horses moving, we were the ones that moved and the horses watched us.



FROM THE SHOP BENCH by Bob Travis



Getting the Right Air for your Carburetor

The article below appeared in Technical Q and A section of the Restorer Magazine. Good information

AIR ADJUSTMENT

Problem:

When you turn the carburetor air adjustment screw in (clockwise), are you making the mixture richer or leaner? My 'A¹ has a tendency to want to stall when you slow down to turn a corner and have the clutch in to shift into second gear. I have set the idle up higher than it should be to avoid the stall problem. Does this seem like an idle mixture that is too lean or too rich? I have heard both opinions expressed.

Solution:

The carburetor air adjustment affects idle air mixture only. For this adjustment to work correctly you must have no air leaks around the manifold gasket (intake side) or at the carburetor. Many times the throttle shaft in the upper housing of the carburetor is worn and allows air to be drawn in around the shaft.

- To make correct an adjustment of idle air adjustment screw begin by turning the idle air screw all the way in (CW) to the seat (lightly) and then back out (CCW) 1-1/2 turns. With the spark lever in the full retard position, bring the engine to an idle. Lean the carburetor mixture a little by adjusting the dash adjusting knob for no more than 1/4 turn open.
- Now turn the idle air screw in slowly until the engine starts to stall (Note the position of the screw). It should cause the engine to start to stall out about 1/4 turn in (CW) from where you started.
- Now slowly turn the screw CCW until the engine starts to stall again. Then turn back CW to a point in between the two stall points. This should be about 1-1/2 turns from the seat.

Turning the screw CW reduces the air mixture to the idle fuel, making it a richer mixture (less air). Turning the screw CCW increases the air mixture, there by providing a leaner fuel mixture. If the screw has little or no effect it means you either have an air leak in the idle circuit (usually caused by too much wear around the throttle shaft) or if you have a windshield wiper vacuum line you may have a leak in that line. Put a 1/8" brass pipe plug in the intake manifold vacuum connection to plug it off for testing (1930/1931 only with vacuum wipers).


The problem you describe can also be caused by float level set too high. When the float level is too high the fuel level in the jets is too high and causes a rich mixture when engine vacuum is reduced (as when slowing down to turn a comer). The rich mixture floods the carburetor, causing it stall or quit at reduced speeds.

I used this for about two weeks and then we moved into a house with a dry and bigger garage. It went into storage. They go for \$350 – \$379 plus shipping. You will get two (2) fan motor/assemblies. It is missing the intake foam filter, but I know where you can get one for \$10 plus ground shipping. This one is the tall one (16') that fits a model A perfectly. All for only \$200 or a good offer.








