City of Hope Tour

Friday, December 9

If you missed this tour, you missed a very special one. On Friday, December 9, thirty one Model A'ers met to discover some of the in's and out's of



one of the country's premier cancer treatment and research centers. We were greeted by a large contingent of City of Hope employees including their photographer who took pictures of each couple. After a brief walk to the welcoming center, we had an orientation to the facility and an overview of what our tour would consist of by Tina Pakfar, Vice President of Development Relations and by Kimberly Wah. We learned that their goals are not only the prevention, treatment and cure of cancer but other life threatening diseases including diabetes and HIV/AIDS. They embrace a holistic approach to patients undergoing cure and treatment. There are many trials of potential



medications that are on-going at any time which are aided by the on-site pharmaceutical manufacturing facility. City of Hope is a founding member of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN), a non-profit alliance of 21 U.S. cancer centers. The NCCN publishes clinical practice guidelines for oncological treatment among its member institutions.



The City of Hope is also a graduate university. In 1913, the Jewish Consumptive Relief Association was chartered in Los

Angeles, California, with the intent of raising money to establish a free, non-sectarian sanatorium for persons from throughout the United States diagnosed with tuberculosis. After raising sufficient funds, the association purchased 10 acres of land in Duarte, California, and dubbed the property the Los Angeles Sanatorium.

Opening January 11, 1914, the sanatorium originally consisted of two tents, one for patients and one for caregivers. Today, the City of Hope has 3500 employees and over 100 buildings on the Duarte Campus.



Our tour took us to several of their buildings including the hospital, a support center for patients and families and a research center including a tour of one of the research laboratories. The tour concluded with a beautifully presented luncheon during which we learned more about the research being performed from one of their physician researchers and heard from a cancer survivor, a woman who had been one of our tour leaders.



I think each of the attendees came away somewhat staggered by the extent of what is being done and accomplished and with a renewed sense of appreciation for all that is involved in the efforts to find a cure and to effectively treat cancer. We recognize just how fortunate we are to have a first class facility in our back yard. It is a facility that deserves our financial support.

Give Me a Brake

Do you know that the Model A brake system has 56 places where metal touches metal? Each of these is subject to wear, resulting in diminished braking efficiency, sometimes to the point where there is no braking action (stopping power). Henry Ford is alleged to have said, "There must be metal from the pedal to the road".

The Model A brake system is engineered and designed on this premise. Therefore, because of the mechanical nature of the system, every successful brake job must begin with a complete inspection and correction of the mechanical parts. Adjustment of the brakes is only effective if the ENTIRE brake system is within tolerance and is specified operating condition. No amount of adjustment (including installation of floaters) will provide good stopping brakes from a worn-out system.

Recently a survey was made of the club membership. One of the questions asked went something like this-What aspect of your Mdel A needs improvement? At least 10 members said brakes. In response the board has asked me to present a seminar on the subject.

The seminar will be at a breakfast on Saturday, Jan 21 at Denny's Restaurant, located in Irwindale on Irwindale Rd., just North of the 210 freeway. We will start at 8:30 AM.
