Be Prepared When You Tour

Recently a group of club members made a tour to Bakersfield to attend the CCRG Jamboree, On the return trip one of the cars experienced a flat tire. The owner discovered that he did not have a lug wrench (Crank) and that his aftermarket hydraulic jack did not work (out of fluid). Furthermore, of the six remaining cars in the group, three did not carry jacks and only one of three that had jacks worked!

The following list of tools and supplies is a good checklist for preparing your car for touring. Once you have prepared your car for touring, you will feel more comfortable knowing that, if a problem does occur, you have the tools and parts to fix it. Most important, you should "tailor" your list to fit your car, especially if you have made modifications. Delete those items that are not applicable and add those that are appropriate for your modifications.

Parts
