It was dark in color and pretty beat up but he remembers how excited he was to be sitting beside him on the way home. Grandpa had really wanted a Sport Coupe but settled for that one. He worked on it and then traded for another Model A until he finally found the Sport Coupe.

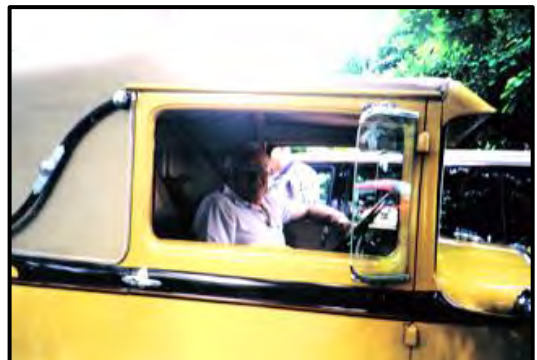
Scott remembers how excited Grandpa was one Christmas to receive a rumble seat step as a gift. Truth be told he probably picked it out himself. Christmas or large family gatherings always included rides in the Sport Coupe. Scott always loved all of his A's and would head to the garage on visits to enjoy the smells of the upholstery and fuel, sit in the cars and do drawings of them.



When he passed in 2005 he wanted the A to go to Scott's uncle. His uncle couldn't keep it so Scott's dad bought it and eventually took it to their home in North Carolina. His parents enjoyed the car until 2021 when they decided it should go to Scott and trailered it out to him in California. Scott had always coveted it but wasn't sure he could keep 2 old vehicles going. He pulled his 1939 Ford pickup out of the garage and covered it in the driveway to make room for it.

Soon after driving it in the hills of Altadena, it was clear the engine needed some attention. A valve job was first on the list. Scott had never done anything like this before but with club member Chris Wickersham guiding him the project was started. Issues with the head gasket sealing was the first thing to crop up after putting things back together. After pulling the head back off and seeing why it wouldn't seal properly, it was reinstalled and after driving it some it finally sealed. A complete rebuild is in the future and Scott's son is taking an interest in it and spent a year in the Pasadena High School Model A Club.

It looks promising that Grandpa Parson's Sport Coupe will stay in the family for another generation to enjoy.
