The Heritage Museum Tour hasn't been done in decades so it's time we did it again. The tour date is 9/7/2024.

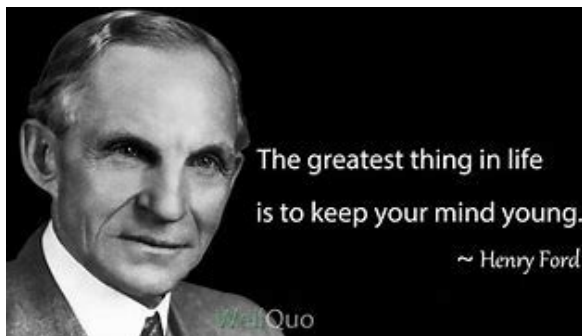

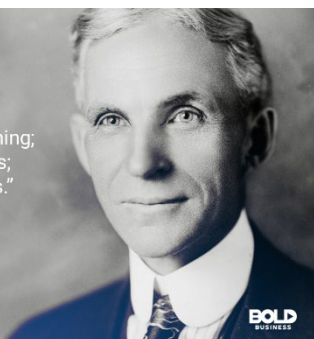

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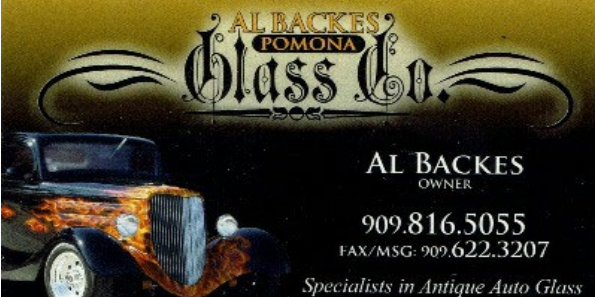
