#### MANEUVERING OUR 50TH



#### Our Golden Anniversary has arrived!

The celebration for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Santa Anita A's will return to the Shakespeare Club of Pasadena which was the scene of our Ruby Anniversary a decade ago. This is a dress-up event although our 50th Anniversary club shirts (the black ones) are also appropriate. You are most welcomed to reach out to former members to invite them. For your convenience an e-blast with an invitation will also be sent.

This is one event not to be missed! There will be cars and people there you haven't seen in a while. Fun is always guaranteed and lots of people have already RSVP'd. Don't miss out!



For over two months club members tried to figure out where the mystery mansion location was on our Pioneers and Pies Tour. No one was successful even after it was disclosed it was near our lunch stop, Marie Calendars.

Twenty-five members and eleven Fords met in the Walmart parking lot and found out they were headed to the John Rowland Mansion in La Puente. The home is located on the La Puente Unified School District office property and our own Nancy Stancil couldn't contain herself. She had worked for the district for over 30 years and was the only one familiar with the property. Upon arriving we were met by Amy Rowland, a 6<sup>th</sup> generation descendant of the family. What better person to have as our docent! All classic cars were escorted through a private gate and were allowed to line up in front of the mansion for photographs.

There are basically three buildings located on the property: the cookhouse, the Rowland home and the Dibble Roundhouse. The mansion was built in 1855 and was the first two-story brick house in Southern California and is the oldest brick house now standing in the area. In 1887 the mansion was remodeled by changing the slope of the roof, stuccoing the brick and adding a kitchen.

The roundhouse is a re-purposed water tank for the ranch that was turned into a museum in 1950 and contains ranch equipment and Indian artifacts. The roof is supported by mahogany beams in a beautiful spiral pattern. All these structures are owned and maintained by the La Puente Valley Historical Society.

An additional bonus to our tour was the discovery of a very special Model A. Descendant Rick Rowland brought an original 1930 roadster sports coup that was purchased by Walter Temple Jr. for his wife Nellie. Mr. Temple's family home is located down the street known as the Workman, Temple Family Homestead Museum. Rick is now the second owner of the Model A.

As we concluded our visit, Santa Anita A members passed the hat and donated over \$200 to help with a mansion restoration project. Amy had tears in her eyes and will use the funds to restore the living room chandelier. Well done A's!


